Those candidates with a B.A. in Political Science or a closely related discipline and who have a grade point average of 2.5 or above are generally admitted into the M.A. programme.

Other candidates can be admitted based on a decision of the Admissions Committee. An additional requirement is that students demonstrate a knowledge of English at the level of UNlcert® III by the third semester.

The M.A. programme includes the following modules:

- Comparative and German politics
- International Relations
- Political Philosophy, Political Theory and History of Ideas
- Politics in non-European areas
- Human Rights and Human Rights Politics
- Methodology of Political Science
- First optional module (to be selected from other disciplines)
- Second optional module (to be selected from other disciplines)

The Erlangen M.A. Programme covers a broad range of topics, including the three classical areas of Political Science, i.e. Political Philosophy, Political Theory and History of Ideas, Comparative and German Politics, International Relations. In addition, the Programme offers trainings on non-European areas as well as Human Rights and Human Rights Politics.

Small course sizes intensify learning processes based on a highly developed culture of communication between students, tutors and professors. English language courses are regularly offered in all of the modules.

Thanks to international exchange and communication programmes established with universities in Finland, France, Italy, Poland, Sweden, Turkey, Hungary and USA, students have the opportunity to spend one of four semesters abroad.
